What's RISC? A spelling mistake? No there is no risk involved!

RISC, or the **R**egister of **I**ndividual **S**tudent **C**ontact, is the data base commonly used by schools to keep track of individual events in a child's school life.

Some children think a RISC entry is undesirable, however this is not always the case.

At PWPS we use RISC to track students who have received Silver and Gold awards. We also use it to keep track of unacceptable behaviour. Sometimes it helps us to identify trends in student behaviour.

RISC can also be used to notify parents of more serious incidents involving their child. If you would like to know more about RISC please feel free to ask me.
