This can be physical or emotional. Many of the incidents we deal with at school involve students finding their social place in the world and are one off "mistakes" that need to be corrected. In most cases a restorative conference stops issues of bullying and I am pleased that there have been no ongoing occurrences of bullying at our school. Learning to live in a social world, as experienced in the playground is an important part of growing up and "making things right" if you do the wrong thing is extremely important.

Staff will be learning more about restorative practices after school finishes for students this year and next year there will be sessions for parents so they can understand how "restorative practices" works.
