#### Sir Douglas Mawson

Mawson falls and thought of cutting the rope but made it back.

Sir Douglas Mawson was very famous in Australia as he had fallen down a Crevasse, he finally made it to the top but then fell back. Left there suspended he was losing hope but thought if he just tried he may make it out, and he did, he had managed to pull himself all the way up again. He probably just had enough strength and belief even without ten day worth of food, so no breakfast, lunch or dinner.

Sadly, he had made all the way back to the base, but the ship had left. Leaving Sir Mawson Douglas there by himself.

#### Amazing survival

Amazing survival when Sir Douglas Mawson who walked through snow and ice and his sled that he cut in half to make it lighter for him.

Travelling with six dogs and three of his colleagues Morrison and his men trekked across the icy desert. Their supplies ran short and resorted to killing their dogs to eat and one of the three men died of food poisoning. After a couple of days the second man died and there was only Sir Douglas Mawson left alive.

On his way back to his station he fell into a crevasse but he was saved thanks to his trusty harness. While dangling high above the great cavern Sir Douglas was able to cut away his rope and climb it to safety. He escaped by pulling himself up the rope and when he got to the top he fell back into the crevasse and he started pulling himself and made it to the top. He made it back to his base and when he got there he found out that no one was there and they had already left without him.

#### Great Escape

Sir Douglas, the first person ever to climb the top of Antarctica's volcanic mountain he made a great escape out of Antarctica's volcanic mountain.

Sir Douglas and Mertz were forced to shoot some dogs and eat them. But later Mertz became sick and died, poisoned by the dog's liver.

Alone, Mawson began one of the most amazing survival ever in his life. For 5 weeks he dragged himself and the sled he had sawed in half, over snow and ice through terrible blizzards, for more than 160km. He fell into a crevasse and was suspended by a rope until, after many attempts; he was able to pull his sick and weakened body up on the rope that held him.

Later, he reported how close he came to deciding to just cutting the rope and plunging to a quick death in the crevasse below. Mawson returned to Antarctica in 1929 again in 1931. He studied marine biology and oceanography in Antarctica.

#### Mawson survives the Antarctic CREVASSE

It was a very sad day for Sir Douglas Mawson, as he was stranded in a crevasse but how did he get there?

Mawson set out to lead the first Australasian Expedition to Antarctica. He set out with 2 partners Mertz and Ninnis. Tragedy struck after just five weeks when Ninnis, six dogs and the sled with the tent, most of the food, spare clothes and other valuable supplies, disappeared down a crevasse.

Mawson and Mertz then had terrible food rations for only 10 days and no food for their six dogs. They were forced to shoot their dogs and eat some of it, but Mertz became sick and died, poisoned by the dog liver that he had earlier consumed.

Alone Mertz began to what has been described as one of the most amazing survival stories of all time. He had trekked over 5 weeks with a sled he had sawed in half, over snow and ice through terrible blizzard and for more than 160 kilometres. He fell into a crevasse and was suspended by a rope held up by his sled. After many attempts he was able to pull his sick and weakened body up the rope that held him up.

Later, he reported how close he came to cutting the rope and plunging down having a quick and easy death in the crevasse below.
