NITS IN THE SCHOOL—PLEASE CHECK YOUR CHILDS HEAD.

As the weather warms up it seems as though head lice is back at school.

Head lice are very common so there is no need to be alarmed, however they should be treated quickly to prevent them from spreading.

We are asking that all parents check their child's hair and look for the following signs:

- Persistent scratching, particularly behind the ears and nape of the neck.
- Tiny silver or white eggs at the base of the hair shaft (it looks like dandruff)
- Small pale brown lice. You may need to use a magnifying glass and a fine tooth come under strong light to help identify lice.

Head lice can be treated quickly & effectively by following these steps:

- 1. Purchase specialist head lice treatment and apply it according to the directions to the pack.
- 2. Examine all family members' hair, and treat everyone found to have head lice at the same time.
- 3. Wash out the treatment and use a fine tooth comb to remove the dead lice & eggs.
- 4. Repeat the treatment in 7-10 days.

To prevent head lice in the first place if your child has a small amount of hair spray or hair gel applied the lice don't like this and cannot stick to the hair.

REVVED UP

Anger Management Program



Learning Links is offering the opportunity to participate in an anger management group for primary school aged children. The aim of the Revved Up program is to help children recognise their responses to different situations that make them angry and provide them with anger management strategies that will assist them in learning to relate positively to others.

Your child will learn how to examine their behaviour including its effect on others and themselves, reflect on reasons to change negative behaviours, as well be encouraged to gain support from others when attempting positive changes. The Revved Up program utilises aspects of narrative therapy, where by Anger is externalised and regarded in terms of its effect on your child's life. Revved Up operates on a weekly basis for one hour sessions over 10 weeks during Term Three and Four. This program is suitable for children in Year 5, and Year 6.

WHO: Students in Years 5, & 6.

WHERE: Learning Links, 10 Railway Parade, Penshurst,

WHEN: Wednesday, 5.15pm-6.15pm, from 5th September, 2012 until 21st November, 2012 (excluding school holidays)
