Stage 3 Extension Group

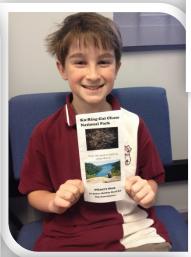

MindUP

This week in MindUP we complete our final two lessons.

Lesson 14 – Performing Acts of Kindness

Good deeds....gestures of generosity....paying it forward. These expressions describe mindful action intended to help another living thing. Participating in such an action constitutes an act of kindness. Acts of kindness can be big or small, spontaneous or well planned. Socially, acts of kindness cultivate shared happiness, build relationships, and give people a sense of connectedness to a group, community, or place — they are an excellent way to build a classroom community full of good will and optimism. The more people practice acts of kindness, the more likely they are to recognise and act on situations in which others are in need.

Things to do at home:

Random Acts of Kindness

At mealtimes, in the car, during bath time, or as you're putting your children to bed, share with each other what kind acts you did. How did being kind make them feel? Which acts made them feel the best? Ask them if they'd like to carry on doing kind things and is so. What would they do?

The Kindness Game

Make up a new game with your children called the Kindness Game. It goes like this: Say that from now on you are each going to do at least three acts of kindness per day. Talk to them about what these might be. For instance, helping a friend at school, cheering someone up who's having a bad day, offering to help with the chores, or telling someone he or she did a good job.

Lesson 15 - Taking Mindful Action in the World

Whether they involve one or many individuals, mindful actions are purposefully planned activities that create a healthier world and set a precedent for other people to follow. In this culminating lesson, children work together to select, plan and execute a group act of kindness for the school or larger community. Through actions like this, children are able to see themselves as part of a larger community.

That brings an end to this years MindUp program. We hope the students have enjoyed the activities and are now thinking a bit more mindfully when approaching situations.

It has been fantastic to see all the classes get involved in this program, thanks to the teachers for all their efforts in ensuring the program's success.

We will have an evaluation of the MindUp program for students, staff and parents. More information to follow in the next newsletter.
