# Selective High School applications for 2017

Applications have been open for selective High School assessments since October. Applications close on November 16. If you are planning to have your child sit the Selective High School Test please complete the online application. Applications can only be made online through this website www.schools.nsw.edu.au/shsplacement The Selective High Schools test will be held on 10th March 2016.





















### **BUS Passes 2016**

A new process for bus passes will commence for students in 2016. The "School Opal Card" will replace the bus passes that students currently have.

Most students who currently have a

pass will receive their pass in 2016 through the school. However an application is needed for any students who:

- have not had a travel pass previously.
- are moving from Yr 2 into Yr 3
- are moving from Yr 6 into Yr 7
- or are changing address or schools.

### How to apply:

Complete application at Transportnsw.info/school-students Print and sign application then submit to school.

## Who is eligible?

K-2 students - No minimum distance. 3-6 students - who live 1.6Km in a straight line or 2.3 km walking. 7-12 students - 2.0 km in a straight line or 2.9 km walking.

# Primary Ethics Classes At Penshurst West

Since early 2011, NSW public school children have had a legal right to attend classes in philosophical ethics at their school if:

- their parents give permission for them to go to ethics classes, and
- Primary Ethics can provide trained and vetted volunteers to organise and teach the classes.

Classes are available to all children from Kindergarten to Year 6 who don't attend the available Scripture/SRE (Special Religious Education) classes in their school. However, Primary Ethics can only provide these classes if it has trained volunteers from either the school community or the wider community.

## What are ethics classes?

Ethics is a branch of philosophy that examines ethical concepts and issues, asking what is right or wrong in particular circumstances. Our curriculum comprises a wide range of age appropriate topics that primary-aged children find interesting. Students learn to think about these ethical matters together and engage in the give-and-take of reasoned argument. This process allows students to properly consider other people's points of view and to be sincere, reasonable and respectful in dealing with their differences and disagreements.

Our K-6 curriculum has 76 topics, starting with *Questions and Puzzlement*, introducing children to the foundation of ethical thinking. Children in the younger primary years examine issues such as being left out, sharing and bullying, while older children reflect on issues such as homelessness, fairness and teasing to help them consider the feelings and interests of others – one important aspect of moral reasoning. Other aspects include understanding consequences, having empathy and appreciating difference.

Research shows that well-reasoned moral judgement does not develop automatically as young people mature and that these skills are best developed using the methods we employ in ethics classes. Once acquired, these skills accompany individuals into adulthood.

#### Teachers

In 2015, we have had three trained teachers at Penshurst West teaching children from Kindy to Yr 4. One of our teachers is standing down next year, and we need at least one more volunteer teacher to meet the expected demand for ethics classes in 2016.
