Scripture and Ethics classes commence on Thursday 23 February. Just a reminder the lessons will be held every Thursday as follows:

- K-2 12.20pm-12.50pm
- 3-6 12.55pm-1.25pm

These lessons are delivered by authorised representatives of approved religious groups. A Penshurst West Public School teacher is present at all our scripture classes. Students who have opted out of scripture will attend non-scripture where they will be supervised in a separate area. Students have the option to read, do private study or complete independent tasks. No lessons will be provided. Parents may change their child's selection by advising the school office in writing, at any time during the school year.

VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL

Please remember that ALL visitors to the school are required to visit the office before going to one of our classrooms or contacting students in the playground. This is important as it enables the school to have a register of who is in the school at any given time particularly in case of an emergency and most importantly to keep our children safe. Outside of school hours, the easiest way to discuss something with your child's teacher (and less disruptive to their class) is to ring the office and organise an appointment.

RESILIENCE TIPS

Skills in resilience are promoted in NSW Public Schools because through them children fare well in life. Research shows children with good resilience perform better at school and are less likely to take part in risky behaviour, particularly as they enter the teenage years.


- Get connected. Building strong, positive relationships with loved ones and friends can provide you with needed support, guidance and acceptance in good and bad times. Establish other important connections by volunteering or joining a faith or spiritual community.
- Make every day meaningful. Do something that gives you a sense of accomplishment and purpose every day. Set clear, achievable goals to help you look toward the future with meaning.
- Learn from experience. Think of how you've coped with hardships in the past. Consider the skills and strategies that helped you through difficult times. You might even write about past experiences in a journal to help you identify positive and negative behavior patterns and guide your future behavior.
- Remain hopeful. You can't change the past, but you can always look toward the future. Accepting and even anticipating change makes it easier to adapt and view new challenges with less anxiety.
- Take care of yourself. Tend to your own needs and feelings. Participate in activities and hobbies you enjoy. Include physical activity in your daily routine. Get plenty of sleep and create consistent bedtime rituals. Eat a healthy diet. Practice stress management and relaxation techniques, such as yoga, meditation, guided imagery, deep breathing or prayer.
- Be proactive. Don't ignore your problems. Instead, figure out what needs to be done, make a plan and take action. Although it can take time to recover from a major setback, traumatic event or loss, know that your situation can improve if you work at it.

WHAT IS POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING (PBL)?

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) provides the framework for a whole school, evidence-based approach to behaviour support. Penshurst West PS takes an instructional approach to behaviour, recognising that we need to teach the behaviours required. At Penshurst PS, we believe a positive school environment, where all students are included and feel safe and supported improves student learning outcomes. We are currently looking into more signage to be displayed around the school to remind students of the positive behaviour expectations that will help to make everyone feel safe, included and happy at school.

As shown at the Meet the Teacher session the teachers talked about the school behaviour system. It is really appreciated if you can talk to your child about the importance of following the school expectations of behaviour as this helps create a safe and happy place for all to be.
